MASTER'S DEGREE IN INTERNATIONAL AND EUROPEAN LAW

Specialisation: Public International Law



ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

This course is open to students with a first-year Master's degree or equivalent degree from a French or foreign higher education institution.

Applications are reviewed by a teaching committee, taking into account the necessary prerequisites and the candidate's academic record and motivations. The procedure may involve an interview or practical exercise. The course can be undertaken as part of one's initial training or continued education.

OBJECTIVES

This course equips students with the skills required for their professional integration within academic and international professional environments. In particular, it provides them with a strong knowledge of legal issues and regimes, as well as methodological skills so they can meet the common expectations of the various professional sectors that relate to international law.

- In-depth knowledge of several areas of international law
- Understanding of political and legal issues specific to international relations
- Mastery of procedural and litigation aspects of the peaceful settlement of disputes
- Acquisition of research, argumentation, writing and public speaking methods to meet the expectations of international environments
- Ability to manage and resolve disputes in connection with international law
- Ability to work in a foreign language and in a multicultural environment

PREREQUISITES

Applicants must have a strong background in public international law or international relations. They should have completed the majority of the following modules:

- Public international law
- Law of international organisations (including EU law)
- International business law
- International law of collective security
- International human rights law
- International criminal law and international humanitarian law
- Environmental law

Applicants must be fluent in French. Fluency in other languages, including at least English, is an asset.

- Lawyer specialising in international litigation
- Lawyer in a government administration, especially in the legal departments of institutions working in the field of international relations

Teaching

This course is taught through a combination of lectures providing students with major theoretical perspectives, and seminars providing a more in-depth knowledge through readings and discussions.

Students also attend many conferences presented by visiting lecturers and various workshops – including a Legal clinic – allowing them to apply their knowledge and acquire essential professional skills to prepare for their professional integration.

Many aspects of the work, whether individual or collective, written or oral, strengthen the students' ability to write and express themselves in a strongly internationalised context.

The dissertation and the internship help students towards their professional objective.
